CONSENT ORDER

WHEREAS, on February 7, 2017, the Rhode Island Ethics Commission found that there was probable cause to believe that the Respondent, Thomas Rose, Jr., violated R.I. Gen. Laws § 36-14-5(a) and (d) by using the color of his office as a member of the East Providence City Council, holding the ceremonial title of “Mayor,” to avoid or delay payments due and owing in his personal capacity to Enterprise Rent A Car; and

WHEREAS, the Respondent and the Commission prosecutor have agreed to submit the instant Consent Order, including all of its terms and its proposed civil penalty, to the Ethics Commission for its review and approval; and

WHEREAS, the Respondent understands that, if approved, this Consent Order will constitute a final agency action and the Respondent waives any further procedural steps or judicial review of any aspects of this complaint process.


THEREFORE, it is hereby


ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED

THAT, the Ethics Commission incorporates and adopts by reference the facts set forth in the “Results of Investigation” section of the Investigative Report;


THAT, the Respondent, Thomas Rose, Jr., violated R.I. Gen. Laws § 36-14-5(a) and (d) by using the color of his office as a member of the East Providence City Council, holding the ceremonial title of “Mayor,” to avoid or delay payments due and owing in his personal capacity to Enterprise Rent A Car; and

THAT, the Respondent is ordered to pay a civil penalty in the amount of ~~Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750)~~. Five Hundred Dollars (\$500).
